Economic Impact of Local Park and Recreation Spending to State Economies

America's local public park and recreation agencies generated more than \$154 billion in economic activity and supported more than 1.1 million jobs from their operations and capital spending alone in 2015.

The state-level analysis followed that of the national study and considers the economic impact of local park and recreation agencies' operations and capital spending. The estimates of total economic impacts include the direct, indirect and induced effects of local park and recreation agency spending in each state.
