- **Street Art Project**

 - Tory discussed the changes in language to the amendments to the renewal plan. These changes will be taken to the city council for approval

 - A concern was raised about a camp across from Capital Manor. (WSNA will reach out to the city and pass along the information)
- The Executive board developed the goals listed below for 2023. A

question came up on how we plan to measure these goals. The Chair stated that he would work with the executive board to establish some type of tracking and reporting out on how we are doing to those goals.

- Collaborate with City Management and staff to have an equal voice/input in City Government, decisions and help improve city processes.
 - Address transportation impacts from new developments and make recommendations as appropriate. Ensure that WSNA vision is included in the updated Salem Transportation Plan
 - Work towards an equitable solution to the Houseless Crisis and associated Mental Health needs of Houseless individuals.
 - Improve WSNA outreach methods to encourage more participation in local City Government and awareness of important local issues.
 - Continue support of local parks, creating new parks, green space and park improvements, and continued stewardship and review of local environmental issues and any associated quality of life impacts.
- Neighborhood Traffic Management Plan
 - Julie Warncke presented this plan and discussed it (please see attachment she provided for more detail)
 - Councilor Updates
 - Councilor Stapleton was named the Councilor President
 - There will be councilors retreat in January
