

RESOLUTION NO. 3645

WHEREAS, a certain Redwood (Sequoia Gigantea) tree, located on westerly side of North Summer Street immediately north of Union Street, was planted by William Waldo, a prominent pioneer of Salem who long resided in the vicinity of said tree, and

WHEREAS, the Salem Chapter of the American War Mothers desire that this tree and that area around said tree now within the cement curbing be designated as "Waldo Park" in memory of said William Waldo; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALEM, OREGON: That said request be granted and that area now surrounded by a cement curbing be and the same is hereby designated and made a city park, to be named "Waldo Park" in memory of William Waldo, a prominent citizen and pioneer of the city of Salem, Oregon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That said Waldo Park shall be at all times hereafter under the control of the Salem Park Board, together with any sign or marking to be maintained on said tree and park.
