- 30 by 30 campaign to increase females in law enforcement to 30% by 2030.
 Currently at 15%
- Lots of hiring. Down 20 officers which is about 10%
- Navigation center w/ mid willamette valley community access center. Located at Mission st between 19th and 21st on the south side of road. Behind credit union. Near k-mart. 24/7 open. 75 low barrier beds
- Discussion on National Night Out fundraiser to support dog program
- b. City Councilor(s) 5 minutes
 - Over 780 people submit to SKATS
 - Opening Ceremony for a 52 bed unit with wraparound services near state hospital
 - \$150m to new shelter beds but need to be used in a year. Potential partnership with Marion Polk Housing Authority
 - Orchard Park apartments will now go to market rate and 80 residents will be interested
 - Working to take over with a non-profit
 - Need \$20m to upkeep and buy
 - Fourth of July fireworks at fairgrounds
 - · Cannery mixed use right on the River coming
 - First budget meeting 4/19.
 - New revenue is key. Legally capped amount of growth on property taxes by 3%. Inflation is 7%.
 - Employee payroll tax (Eugene has done this)
 - 0.49% would be status quo (no unhoused programs)
 - 0.66% maintain unhoused and get more fire/police
 - Bond can't buy people just things
 - Hoping to get \$5m a year from state since they pay no tax on land
 - council can increase operations fee
 - Could be 10% cut across the boards (2 fire stations closed, 3 days a week library, close West Salem library)
 - Could be a referendum

 - ACT 50+ is participating

 - Gardener Agreement this year (guidelines)
 - Almost lost garden. under scrutiny; changes to the garden without permission not allowed

- a. Quarterly Chairs Meeting Recap (Ryan Erickson-Kulas)
 - Councilor Gwyn mentioned the opening of Mahonia Hall, the 313-unit multigenerational affordable housing facility, with on-site programming for residents.
 Some units are 60%, some 80% area median income. Salem Housing Authority is a partner in the project.
 - There is quite a lot going on including Salem In Motion, Neighborhood Traffic Management Plan, Walkable Mixed Use Areas, and Climate Friendly Areas.
 The Transportation Systems Plan, which will be informed by many of these other planning efforts, will take several years to complete with many opportunities for community engagement and Neighborhood Association input
 - new library hours. West Salem M-Th from 12-5 pm and Saturday from 12-6 pm.
 Main library T/W/Th from 10-8 pm, Fri/Sat from 10-6 pm
 - Make Music Day Jun 21
 - We presented on Outreach efforts
