Firefighting Trucks and Equipment with Bond Proceeds

Thank you for supporting the Bond Measure

\$19.89M in fire trucks and equipment, including:

- 16 fire engines
- 2 ladder trucks
- 1 heavy rescue vehicle
- 1 air rescue vehicle
- 2 wildland fire engines
- 2 ambulances
- 1 aircraft rescue and firefighting truck

The state eliminated parking mandates for Oregon cities. The parking reforms apply to 48 Oregon Cities in Oregon's eight metropolitan areas (Albany, Bend, Corvallis, Eugene/Springfield, Grants Pass,Portland Metro, Rogue Valley, Salem?Keizer) and counties in these areas with more than 5,000 people inside the urban growth boundary but outside city limits with urban sewer and water services (Clackamas, Marion, Washington)

Mos Adams did a study of Salem and other city budgets. Budgets are at a point of critical concern for trying to supply city services due to the repercussions from Measures 5 and 50 limiting the increase in property taxes to 3%/year. City looking at options for generating revenue to fund services. Salem's General Fund will be gone by June 2025.

They are looking at options with fees and an employee paid payroll tax to meet the costs of city services. If not implemented will need to cut City services. City will tax worker payrolls in Salem. Not sure yet how this will impact remote workers.
