- 1. Welcome and Call To Order The meeting was called to order at 10:04 a.m.
- 2. Public Comment
  - Bob Cortright, 350 Salem: Supported actions to achieve Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) reductions.
  - Laurie Dougherty, 350 Salem: Supported actions to provide safe active transit options.
- 3. Approval of Meeting Minutes from May 13, 2024 -

Motion: Councilor Stapleton made a motion to accept the minutes. This was seconded by Councilor Varney. Motion was approved 3-0.

- 4. Strategy TL 1 & TL 19 Transportation System Plan Updates, presentation by Julie Hanson (Transportation Planning Manager) and Eunice Kim (Long Range Planning Manager).
  - Phase 1 of Transportation System Plan is a Regional Scenario Planning and this requirement came out of the Climate-Friendly and Equitable Community rules from the State.
  - State set goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions including specific targets for the Salem-Keizer Region to meet 30% Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) per capita by 2050.
  - In creating the regional scenarios, the model will test example levers to find ways for the City to meet the requirements.
  - Mayor Hoy requested information on the Free Youth Bus Pass program and if that was shown to have a reduction in VMT.
  - The regional scenario planning uses a model assumed state-led future assumptions would meet the target, Salem can choose to apply that scenario or create an alternate scenario.
  - Community engagement with over 270 responses, support for active transportation and mixed-use development.
  - Phase 1 ought to be completed Winter 2024, staff are working on Phase 2 simultaneously.
  - The final Transportation System Plan will be financially constricted, items on the plan must be based on anticipated funding and are projected to meet the emissions reduction goals.

# 5. Urban Sustainability Directors Network Cascadia Annual Meeting Recap, presentations by Julianah Douglas (Climate Action Plan Manager).

- Regional sustainability professionals leveraging efforts of other communities, building Salem's capacity, and reducing implementation time.
- Electric vehicle car share is being explored and adopted in the region for use of municipal passenger fleet and for low-income multi-family housing to reduce high emission trips and improve mobility.

# 6. Strategy EN 01 – Creating and Implementing a Climate Lens presentation by Julianah Douglas (Climate Action Plan Manager).

- Policy discussion to provide options for policy lens options.
- Climate Lens Types:
  - Quantitative: Scoring tool using modeling and expert analysis.
  - Qualitative: Questionnaire for non-experts to build collaboration.
- Tool Comparison:
  - Quantitative: Requires emissions data, less bias, expertise needed, suitable for larger projects.
  - Qualitative: No data required, more bias, flexible, suitable for smaller projects.
- Feedback:
  - Mayor Hoy and Councilor Stapleton supported objective metrics.
  - Councilor Stapleton suggested merging options.
  - Councilor Varney agreed with a hybrid approach.
- Agreed Direction: Draft a universal climate lens tool using a combination of qualitative and quantitative methods. To be vetted by the Leadership Team.

# 7. Climate Action Plan Updates presentation by Julianah Douglas (Climate Action Plan Manager).

- Airport Solar Feasibility Study: identified the financially feasible option is solar covered parking.
   Mayor Hoy poised parking improvements may be inconsistent with CAP Committee objectives.
- RFP for Municipal Energy Master Plan: Restructured into Part A (Municipal Facilities) and Part B (Municipal Operations).
- **Energy Savings Performance Contracting (ESPC):** Invitation from U.S. DOE to participate. CAP Committee interested in learning more and for leadership team to learn more.
- Employee Idle Reduction Campaign: Rolling out for Summer 2024.
- Community Outreach Campaign: Promoting water and energy conservation.
- **EPA Green Power Partnership and Green Power Community:** Salem is eligible to receive this plaque/ award with annual reporting.
- ICLEI Memo on updates to 2021 Greenhouse Gas Inventory: Recommending internal staff to conduct future inventories to reduce errors.
