A Local Historic Resource Designation proposal to designate the Criterion Schoolhouse (c.1912), as a local historic resource, zoned PA (Public Amusement), and located at 2330 17th Street NE 97304; Marion County Assessors Map and Tax Lot number: 073W14DA00100.

HEARING PROCEDURE:

The hearing will be conducted with the staff presentation first, followed by the applicant's case, neighborhood organization comments, testimony of persons in favor or opposition, and rebuttal by the applicant, if necessary. The applicant has the burden of proof to show that the approval criteria can be satisfied by the facts. Opponents may rebut the applicant's testimony by showing alternative facts or by showing that the evidence submitted does not satisfy the approval criteria. A hearing is not a venue to ask questions of staff, the applicant, or the decision maker(s) on this case but rather an opportunity to provide testimony to the decision maker(s) on the merits of the land use case; questions about the application, the recommended conditions of approval, or the Planning Administrator's recommendation, should be directed to the Case Manager prior to the hearing.

Any participant may request an opportunity to present additional evidence or testimony regarding the application. A ruling will then be made to either continue the Public Hearing to another date or leave the record open to receive additional written testimony. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter prior to the close of the Public Hearing with sufficient specificity to provide the opportunity to respond to the issue, precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA) on this issue. A similar failure to raise constitutional issues relating to proposed conditions of approval precludes an action for damages in circuit court.

Following the close of the Public Hearing a decision will be issued and mailed to the applicant, property owner, affected neighborhood association, anyone who participated in the hearing, either in person or in writing, and anyone who requested to receive notice of the decision.

CRITERION SCHOOL

A little bit of Wasco County history that graces the state fairgrounds.

Children first attended classes at the one-room Criterion School in 1912. The Criterion was the first school in Wasco County to obtain the classification of "Standard" and served up to 25 children at a time.

Although it ceased to operate as a school in 1925, the building continued to serve the surrounding community as a Sunday school, Grange Hall, voting place, and other public events. In 1969, the building was sold to a local rancher and used for hay and grain storage.

In 1976, the Criterion Schoolhouse began a new life and a 200-mile journey to the Oregon State Fairgrounds in time for the celebration of the Bicentennial of the United States. The schoolhouse was chosen from more than 50 schools from around Oregon, to serve as a tribute to Oregon public education. Today, it's a must-see for fans of Oregon history.



The Future of the Criterion School

The Oregon State Fair and Exposition Center congratulates the Oregon Retired Educators Association (OREA) for its ongoing efforts to preserve, restore, and enhance the Criterion Schoolhouse. Each year, OREA provides over 70 volunteers to host thousands of visitors to this historic treasure.

OREA has played an ongoing part in fundraising to replace the roof, refurbish the windows, install gutters, and paint the building. Last summer, a siding workshop put on by the Historic Preservation and Restoration Program at Clatsop Community College addressed dry rot issues in the exterior walls of the building.

The Criterion Schoolhouse typically opens each year during the Oregon State Fair where visitors can learn about the interesting history and see the artifacts. Children can color in pictures of Oregon while others look at the books used at the time of Criterion School. Some date back to the 1800's.

CRITERION SCHOOLHOUSE PLACED ON NATIONAL SCHOOLHOUSE REGISTER

RECOGNITION CEREMONY ON AUGUST 10, 2023

The Criterion Schoolhouse, located in Salem on the Fairgrounds at the Oregon State Fair and Exposition Center, was placed on the National Schoolhouse Register by the Country School Association of America (CSAA) on December 2, 2022. The Oregon Retired Educators Association submitted the nomination through its Save the Criterion School Committee. CSAA lists former or current school buildings considered worthy of recognition on a national level for their preservation. The Criterion Schoolhouse is the first Oregon school building to receive this designation!

The Criterion Schoolhouse was the first school-in Wasco County to be declared 'standard' and was used as a school from 1912-1925. The Oregon Department of Education searched statewide for abandoned one-room schoolhouses from 1975-1976. Criterion was chosen out of 50 candidates to be moved 200 miles to the Oregon State Fairgrounds for the 1976 Bicentennial Celebration.

The historical treasure still stands on the Oregon State Fairgrounds as a symbol and tribute to Oregon's public education.

Placements on the CSAA registry are awarded to school buildings that are at least 50 years old, have been restored, renovated, or reconstructed to retain the integrity of their original design, and are well maintained. The hope of CSAA is that this registry will identify the historical and architectural significance, recognize the preservation achievements, and encourage the continual care of the Criterion School.

The Criterion Schoolhouse was constructed between 1912 and 1913, to educate children in the homesteading area near Wasco.

Criterion was the first school in Wasco County to be declared "standard", meaning the schoolhouse met all minimum standards set by the county superintendents. The school remained in operation until 1925, when the Dalles-California Highway was completed to Maupin.

Although the students were being bused into Maupin, the schoolhouse was still used for Sunday School, for voting, and for dances and other community events. Eventually the site was purchased by a local rancher in 1969, and the building was used for hay and grain storage.

In November of 1975, through Spring of 1976, the Oregon Department of Education searched statewide for an abandoned one-room schoolhouse to showcase an eventual Tribute to Public Education The Criterion School was chosen because it is a typical example of an early schoolhouse. The building was in excellent condition due largely to the dry climate. The school was donated to the State of Oregon by its owners, and in July 1976, the men of the National Guard, Company B, 1249th Engineer Battalion traveled to eastern Oregon to prepare the building to be moved to Salem. The school was cut into two sections, loaded, moved onto two flatbed trailers, and traveled 200 miles to the Fairgrounds. With both labor and construction materials donated, the work progressed daily to restore the school in time for the 1976 State Fair.

All restoration and repair work performed on the Fairgrounds site has been in keeping with period appropriate materials and standards.
