NOTICE OF DECISION DATE: August 5, 2015

REQUEST: Minor historic design review of a proposal to remove a dying American Beech (Fagus grandifolia) and replace with an in-kind Beech tree on the grounds of Deepwood Estates, individually listed on the National Register, and a contributing resource within the Gaiety Hill/Bush's Pasture Park National Register Historic District, on property within the PA (Public Amusement) District, and located at 1116 Mission Street SE (Marion County Assessors Map and Tax Lot number: 073W27DD00100).

OWNER/ APPLICANT: Jan Staszewski for City of Salem Public Works

LOCATION: 1116 Mission Street SE, 97302

CRITERIA: Salem Revised Code (SRC) Chapter 230

FINDINGS: The applicant proposes to replace a Beech tree, a historic contributing feature on the grounds of Deepwood Estates. Staff determined that the following criteria from SRC Chapter 230 are applicable to this project:

Criteria 230.060. (q) **Site Features.** Replacement or alteration of site features of a historic contributing building and individually listed public historic resources that are identified as significant features on the historic resource inventory, including, but not limited to, driveways, sidewalks, gardens, significant trees, or geological features is allowed, unless the replacement or alteration would materially alter or destroy the features.

- (1) Materials. Materials shall duplicate, to the greatest degree possible, the appearance and physical qualities of the original materials. Example: Rhododendron hedge planted during the period of significance is replanted with heritage varieties available during the period of significance.
- (2) **Design.** The design shall reproduce, to the greatest extent possible, the appearance of the original site feature. Example: If the site contains a Lord and Schryver garden, the replacements shall be allowed provided the original design and location of plantings of the historical garden are retained.

Findings

Materials

The applicant is proposing to replace the existing dying American Beech tree with a new Beech tree thereby meeting SRC 230.060 (q)(1).

<u>Design</u>

The existing American Beech tree is approximately thirty to forty years old, with a diameter of 27" dbh and is fifty feet tall. The tree is in poor health, and according to the City of Salem's Urban Forester: "The tree is experiencing severe decline with the loss of crown integrity. The tree will not recover and there is no measure that can be employed to preserve the tree. In the near future additional limbs or the whole tree may fail."

The applicant is proposing to replace the Beech with a new, healthy American Beech, fifteen feet in height with a diameter of 2" dbh. The tree will be planted in approximately the same location, reproducing to the greatest extent possible, the appearance of the original site feature, thereby meeting SRC 230.060(q)(2).

DECISION: Based upon the application materials deemed complete on, July 10, 2015, and the findings as presented in this report, the application is APPROVED.



The appeal must be filed in duplicate with the City of Salem Planning Division. The appeal fee must be paid at the time of filing. If the appeal is untimely and/or lacks the proper fee, the appeal will be rejected. The Salem Historic Landmarks Commission will review the appeal at a public hearing. After the hearing, the Historic Landmarks Commission may amend, rescind, or affirm the action, or refer the matter to staff for additional information.
