Discussion	Jeff Keniston assigned for the year Contact jkeniston@cityofsalem.net Issues of Concern Q. Fireworks on New Year's create a war zone on 20th and Madison A. SPD will respond if fireworks are illegal, the caller must know the person doing the fireworks and agree to be a witness. Q. Camping & littering mess under 12 St. Who owns the land? A. This area is patrolled by the downtown bicycle police. The priority is to respond to aggressive panhandling. Litter is generally handled by the community Response Section. The policy is to post a warning. Laura Buhl (LB) wants to organize a monthly clean up. Contact Officer Jantz several weeks before the planned clean up to post the illegal campsite signs. LB wanted to know if Salem had an ordinance that prohibited camping near a water way. Some wilderness areas have limitations to reduce pollution. Cpl. Keniston will look into it. Q. NEN has a traffic problem. People do not stop at cross walks, run signs and speeding? Experience on Marion St. near the ODOT building where the person made a prohibited turn. When reported to ODOT staff member said the sign were going to be removed. A. Cpl. Keniston will look into it. Q. Concern about Pedestrian safety at crosswalks and what are the signals that pedestrians must use to signal drivers of their intent to cross the street. Is a hand signal enough? What is the legal wording of intent? A. The pedestrian must signal intent but this is not enough to write a ticket that will hold up in court. Many pedestrians are at the cross walks for other reasons than crossing the street. Alan Scott Concern that the city does not have enough marked crosswalks. Told by city staff that they do not want to create a "false sense of security" Rochelle Santiago – Drivers will continue to drive even when the Flashing light crosswalk on Market is on. Her son now walks to the crossing at 17th and Market Q. Concern about people going into yard while working on reconstructing fence and stealing tools. A. Do not leave anything in yard. ✓ Ballot Measure 101 (Health Care) Rochelle Santiago, Oregon Health Plan, Yes on 101

Cindy Kimball – Ballot will be coming in the mail for Measure 101. Last summer the legislature passed an assessment on Hospitals and Health Insurance to create a

\$ 100,000 pool to unlock \$ 3 billion of federal matching money for the Oregon Health Plan

Discussion

Rochelle Santiago: This assessment on health insurance and hospitals funds a stabilization to keep premiums low, You will be hearing radio shows speaking against this assessment. Most of people on the Oregon Health Plan are children and people with disabilities.

Discussion: Anti-abortion scare tactics were used to collect signatures for this ballot even though its goal is for expanding Oregon Health Plan of which most users are children. Anti immigrant groups also collected signatures. Frustration that the US runs its health care system this way. Not done in Europe where no questions are asked. Sick people are treated.

	Cindy Kimball talked to a previous city forester who said that the trees were diseased. No notice was put up. Margo Wryn was invited to talk about the tree issue. She says that she was notified in early September. That was 4 months ago. Sarah Rohrs asked whether they were all diseased. Jacqueline Schindele said that they were taken out at this time because the disease is dormant and there is less chance for it to spread because e it is cold. They will not replant until the autumn because of the disease. Discussion on the future of the trees on D St., the fate of the black walnut stumps, the loss of tree canopy to the neighborhood and the development of the State Hospital land. Sarah discussed having an independent arborist look at trees before cutting. This experience has raised a lack of trust in the city's transparency.
